Founded in 1911, the Museum of Arnhem in the Netherlands is dedicated to modern and contemporary art. The museum is housed in a magnificent historic building on the outskirts of the city, overlooking the Rhine. The modern wing was built in 1998.

It was designed to be light and spacious, providing a modern setting for the display of works of art. The museum houses diverse collections ranging from painting and sculpture to photography and digital media.
